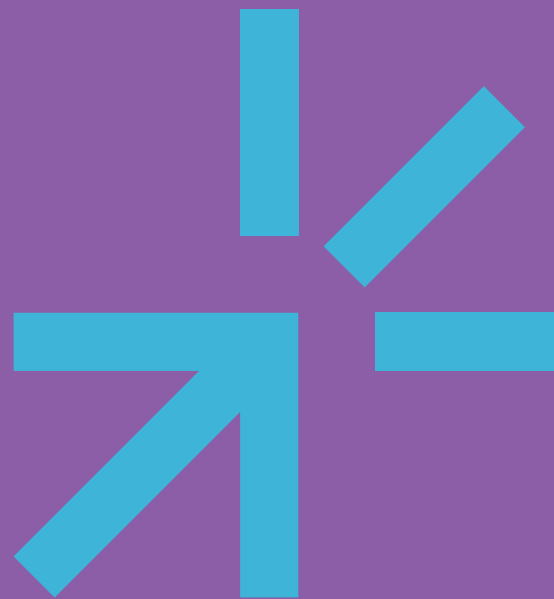

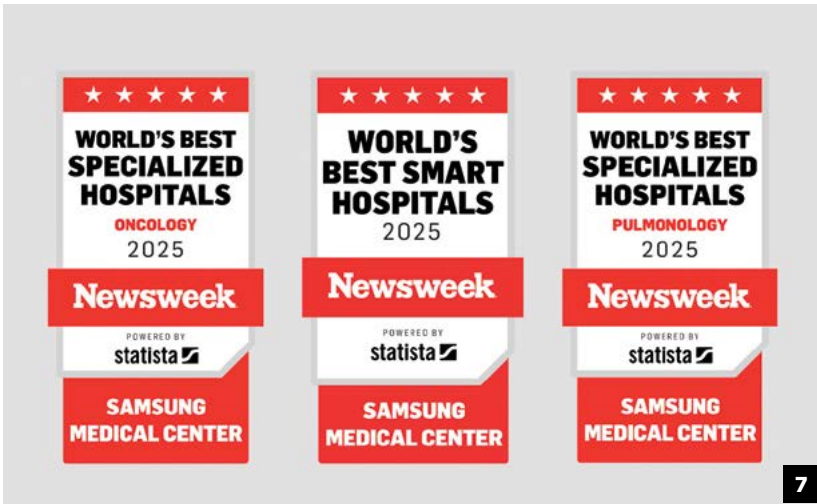

# Overview and Status

## 1. Overview

As of December 31, 2024, Samsung Medical Center (SMC) has a total of 7,929 staff members, operating 1,766 beds with 915 physicians, 3,337 nurses, along with pharmacists and medical technicians. The clinical statistics for 2024 include 2,105,557 outpatients, 82,357 unique inpatients, and 36,805 surgical procedures.

Although the COVID-19 pandemic, which had persisted for over three years, came to an end, the year was marked by operational challenges resulting from the government-physician conflict, which led to temporary workforce shortages and disruptions in clinical services. Nevertheless, celebrating its 30th anniversary, SMC held a commemorative ceremony on November 8, declaring a "grand transformation into a leading hospital shaping the future of medicine over the next 30 years." The year concluded with a renewed commitment to take another leap forward as one of the premier hospitals of the Republic of Korea.

### ● Response to the Government-Physician Conflict Crisis

The conflict between the government and medical community over the expansion of medical school enrollment quotas led to the submission of resignation letters by a large number of resident physicians on February 20, initiating disruptions in patient care and surgical schedules. Subsequent efforts were made to minimize the aftereffects through internal personnel adjustments, but the hospital's performance fell considerably short of the initial annual plan.

### ● Conclusion of the COVID-19 Crisis Response

With the official end of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2023, the operation of the COVID-19 screening clinic ceased on August 31, 2023. The guideline that mandated wearing

masks upon entry to prevent the spread of new infectious diseases was eased. On May 1, 2024, the in-hospital mask recommendation was lifted and the situation room was closed, effectively concluding the COVID-19 response.

### ● Clinical Division

In 2024, the Samsung Medical Center continued to set numerous national "firsts" and "bests." On January 25, the SMC was selected as the sole national model hospital in a pilot project to strengthen the severe-case medical treatment system, run by the Ministry of Health and Welfare. The Rare Disease Center was designated as the "Seoul Metropolitan Area Rare Disease Specialized Institution."

It was also a year of numerous achievements across various clinical departments.

A ceremony was held on January 22 to commemorate reaching the milestone of 20,000 robotic surgeries. In March, a team led by Professor Sang Jin Kim of the Department of Ophthalmology performed the first administration of Luxturna in Korea, a treatment for hereditary retinal dystrophy. A baby born on April 22 at a national record low birth weight of 360 g was successfully treated and discharged in good health on November 5, marking a significant achievement on the part of the hospital. On June 20, the Head and Neck Cancer Center opened the "Recurrent Head and Neck Cancer Clinic," the first of its kind in Korea. In July, the Stroke Center performed the world's first procedure using the Surpass Elite Flow Divider, an advanced cerebral aneurysm stent. On October 14, the SMC achieved a national first by exceeding 2,000 cases of proton therapy for liver cancer. In November, the Heart Vascular and Stroke Institute became the first in Korea to exceed 200 surgeries for implanting left ventricular assist devices (LVADs). The hospital also surpassed 200 cases of CAR T-cell therapy, a treatment first per-

formed in Korea by the SMC on April 20, 2021. In December, a team led by Professor Sung-soo Jeon of the Department of Urology performed Asia's first prostate cancer surgery using the latest da Vinci 5 robotic surgical system. On December 19, a team led by Professor Young Keun On successfully performed a Pulsed Field Ablation (PFA) procedure, a novel treatment for atrial fibrillation, continuing the trend of record-setting achievements in 2024.

These medical accomplishments garnered international attention. In the "World's Best Specialized Hospitals" rankings announced by the global weekly \*Newsweek\* on September 17, the Cancer Hospital was ranked No. 1 among Korean and Asian hospitals and third globally, reaffirming its status as not only the best in Korea but also a world-class institution in cancer treatment. The Division of Pulmonology was ranked No. 1 in Korea (23rd globally) for the second consecutive year. Additionally, eight departments were ranked within the world's top 100: Gastroenterology (sixth), Urology (ninth), Endocrinology (14th), Neurology (16th), Orthopedic Surgery (39th), and Cardiology (64th). In the "World's Best Smart Hospitals 2025" list released on the same day, the SMC was ranked 18th globally and No. 1 in Korea, being named the smartest hospital in the country for the fourth consecutive year. Reflecting this global recognition, the SMC Cancer Hospital hosted the "2nd International Symposium on Cancer Precision Medicine" on February 2, attended by representatives of Gustave Roussy of France, Europe's leading cancer treatment center, with which the SMC established a collaborative relationship in 2023. A delegation from Charité University Hospital in Germany also visited the SMC for two days starting February 26 to observe its advanced medical facilities.

Furthermore, the Heart Vascular and Stroke Institute, a key specialized center at the SMC, held its 10th-anniversary ceremony on December 16, providing a meaningful

opportunity to share the efforts and achievements in the fields of cardiology, stroke, and vascular medicine.

#### ● Research and Education Division

The SMC's world-class clinical standards translated into globally recognized research activities, making it an active year for national research projects, joint research with external institutions, and symposiums.

On May 22, Professor Se-Hoon Lee of the Division of Hematology-Oncology announced the joint development with KAIST of a single-cell map for 30 cancer types from over 1,500 individuals, creating the world's largest database of its kind. On May 27, a team led by Professor Won-Chul Cha was selected as the lead research institution for the Ministry of Health and Welfare's "AI-based Clinical Support System Development Project Specialized for Emergency Rooms." Professor Cha will oversee this large-scale project from 2024 to 2028, managing a budget of 22.8 billion KRW across 36 institutions, including 17 medical centers, 13 companies, and six universities.

In addition, at the "2024 Government Awards for Health and Medical Technology Promotion" hosted by the Ministry of Health and Welfare on November 28, Professor Se-Hoon Lee of the Division of Hematology-Oncology received the Prime Minister's Commendation. The Minister of Health and Welfare's Commendation for Excellent Research was awarded to Professor Jung Yong Hong (Hematology-Oncology) and Professor Young Bin Song (Cardiology). The Commendation for Emerging Research was awarded to Professor Da-Rae Kim (Cardiology) and Professor Jin Soo Yoo (Transplantation Surgery). The Commendation for Excellent Development was awarded to Professor Kyoung-Mee Kim (Pathology), and the Commendation for Fostering and Promotion was awarded to Team Leader Seung Ho Lim of the Digital Strategy Team. Academic achievements continued across departments. On June 26, the Cancer Hospital opened the "Quality of

Life Research Institute." On November 1, the "2024 SMC Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS) Symposium" was hosted by the Rare Disease Center of the Department of Pediatrics. In the education sector, the Nursing Student Hope Dream Internship Program was conducted in four sessions for 280 participants from January 8 to February 2.

#### ● **Advanced Intelligent Hospital**

Samsung Medical Center is leading digital medical innovation in Korea to establish an advanced intelligent hospital that pioneers the future of medicine. On January 31, 2024, the SMC became the first medical institution in Asia to receive the highest Stage 7 certification in the Analytics Maturity Adoption Model (AMAM) from the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS). This honor made the SMC the world's first institution to achieve a "grand slam" of four Stage 7 certifications, following its 2023 certifications in DIAM (imaging), EMRAM (medical records), and INFRAM (IT infrastructure). The hospital also gained attention for its continuous development of robots for hospital automation. At the invitation of the French National Center for the Development of Medical Professionals, the SMC held the "SMC 5 Digital Transformation (DX) Platforms Workshop" in Paris for 2 days starting January 24, for over 70 CEOs and managers from 25 public medical institutions in France. On January 30, the SMC laid the groundwork for advanced AI by adopting Microsoft (MS) Azure Arc-based automated machine learning (AutoML).

On February 5, the SMC became the first tertiary general hospital to receive certification for "Mobile App/Web Accessibility for Customers" from the Ministry of Science and ICT and the National Information Society Agency. On May 8, the "Autonomous Wheelchair Robot," led by the SMC, was selected for the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport's regulatory sandbox project. On June 5, an MOU was signed with Selvas AI to collaborate on voice recognition-based smart hospital projects and apply voice recognition AI to administrative tasks. On the same day, the SMC was chosen as a leading hospital for the project to build an electronic submission system for indemnity insurance claims.

Furthermore, to minimize inconvenience for patients and

their guardians, the SMC launched the "24/7 Unmanned Medical Record Copy Issuance System" on October 7, a first in the Korean medical field, which received positive feedback. It was a year of progress as a future-leading hospital based on advanced infrastructure, accompanied by favorable external evaluations.

#### ● **ESG, Mutual Growth, Medical Volunteerism, and Healthcare Collaboration Division**

Since establishing its ESG Committee in 2021, Samsung Medical Center has been leading ESG management in the Korean medical community, adopting sustainable management as one of its key principles in 2023. The "2024 ESG Report" was published on August 8, following the 2023 edition. On October 2, the SMC received the first award in the medical industry at the "2024 K-ESG Management Awards" hosted by Dong-A Ilbo. On August 30, it became the only hospital to win the "Grand Prize in the Special Grade Category" at the third Fire Safety Management Awards, demonstrating its leading role in safety within the nation's healthcare sector.

Efforts for mutual growth with the medical community and local society also continued. On January 5, 500 copies of the "Safety Guardian for Our Children" textbook were donated to the Seoul Metropolitan School Health Teacher's Association. Starting July 1, the SMC became the first tertiary general hospital in the nation to use reusable containers at its funeral hall. On July 3, a training program was held for nursing managers and nurses from partner hospitals, followed by the launch of the "SMC Collaborative and Advanced Resource Education Series (S-CARES)" on October 10, a program to enhance the capabilities of staff members within the partner network. The Partners Center hosted the "2024 SMC Excellent Referral Partner Institution Meeting" on October 16 and the "Advisory Committee Meeting" on November 11 to commemorate its 30th anniversary. The Prevention and Rehabilitation Center also held a partner hospital meeting on December 3 to promote mutual growth within the regional medical community.

In medical volunteerism, as the first project under the "Treatment Support for Patients with Cardiac and Facial Deformities" agreement between the SMC and KB Kook-

min Bank, four Indonesian children with heart conditions arrived in Korea on October 20, underwent successful surgery, and returned home safely after being discharged on November 6. The "Smile for a Child" campaign, through which the SMC has provided free treatment to patients with facial deformities nationwide, celebrated its 20th anniversary with a ceremony on December 7, reflecting on its past activities and pledging further development.

### ● Full-Scale Remodeling

As remodeling projects to transform into an advanced intelligent hospital leading the future of medicine began in earnest, changes were made to patient care infrastructure. To minimize customer inconvenience during the transformation, a take-out specialty store, "Picky Pickers," was opened on March 25 to accommodate the main building's basement remodeling. On May 2, 57 electric vehicle chargers were installed in the hospital's parking lot, advancing its status as an eco-friendly institution. On May 13, escalators connecting the basement, first, and second floors of the main building's lobby began operation. The funeral hall lobby was reopened after renovation on October 25, and the clinical trial injection unit for anti-cancer drugs was expanded on the ninth floor of the main building on December 9.

### ● Employee Satisfaction and Organizational Culture Division

Various initiatives were held to support staff members exhausted by the prolonged COVID-19 pandemic and the government-physician conflict.

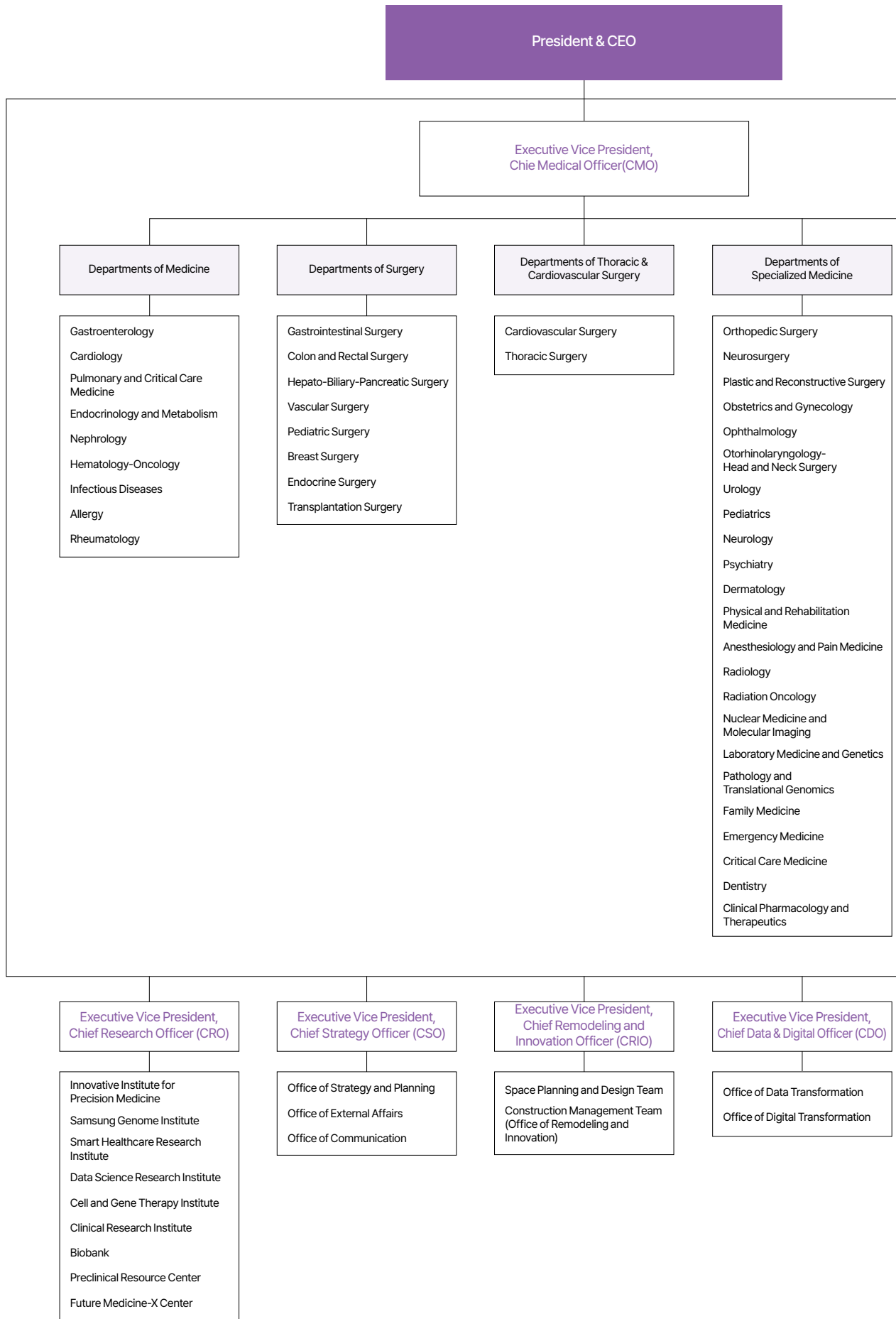
The "1st Happiness Camp of 2024" was conducted for 36 employees from the customer-facing departments on April 9. On April 17, the "English Terminology Standardization Committee" was established under the External Affairs Office. On July 22, a "Caregiver Vitality Boost Event," jointly hosted by the hospital president and the employee council, was held and became a topic of interest on social media. On November 27, the Nursing Division's 30th-anniversary ceremony, "Pioneering a New Path in Nursing," was held grandly. On December 31, the "S-Lounge," an employee rest area, was opened on the

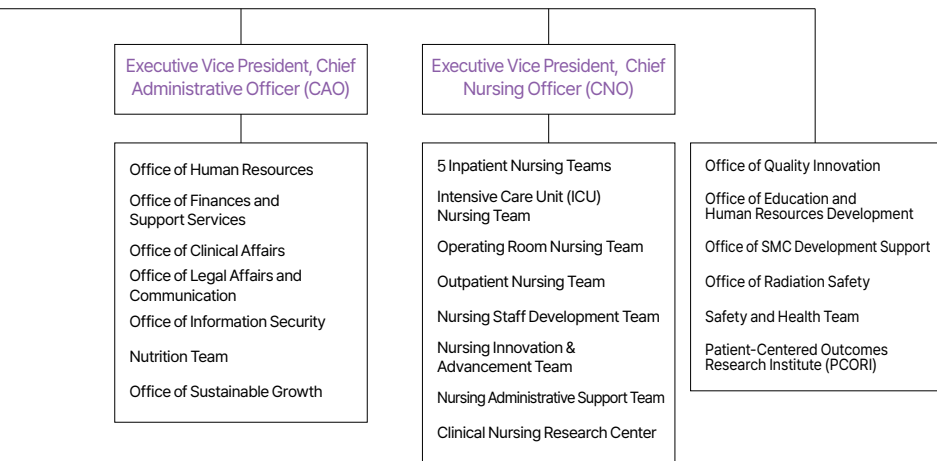
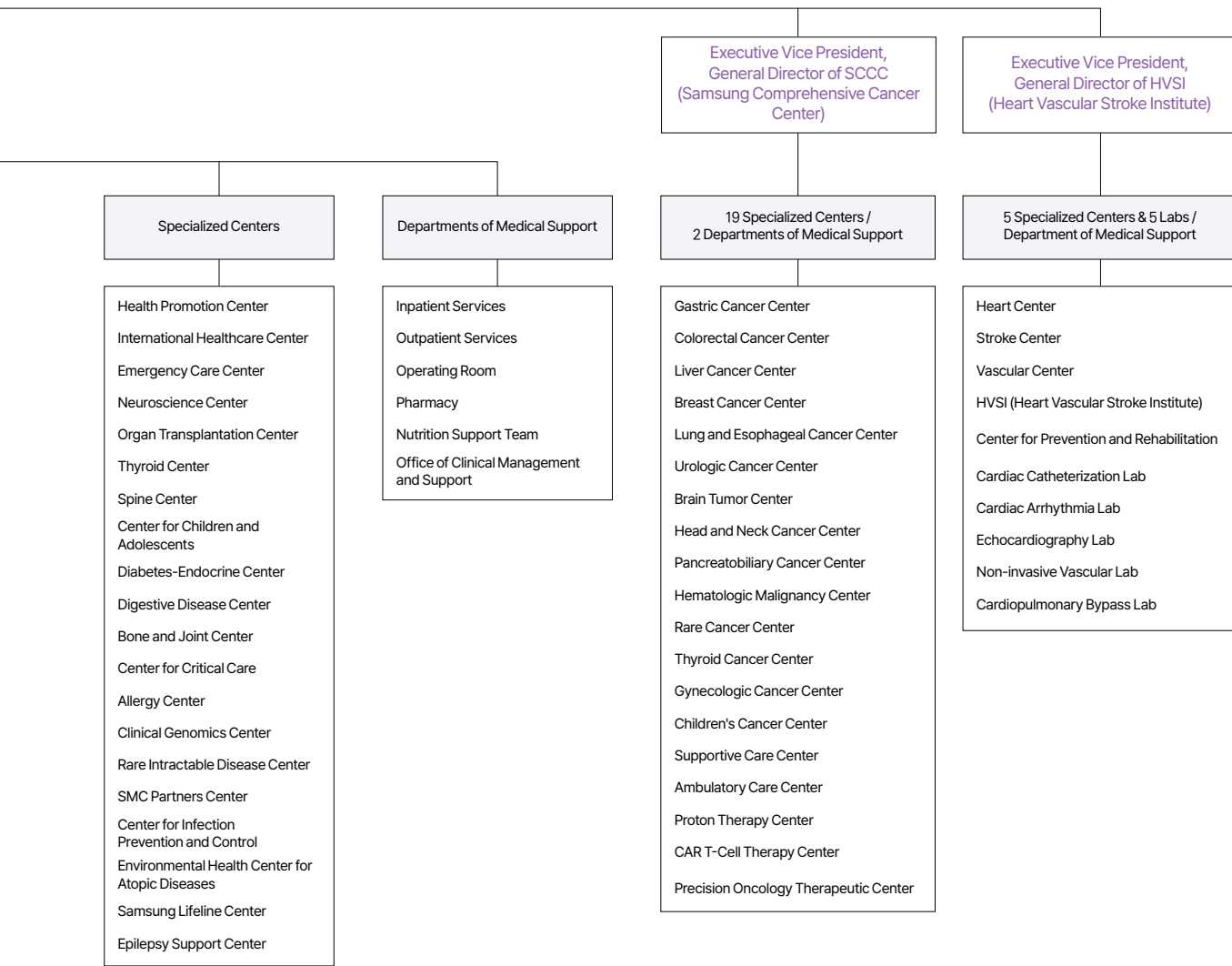
fourth floor of the annex building.

### ● Various External Evaluations and Awards

The dedicated efforts toward innovation in providing the best clinical care, research, education, and building an advanced intelligent hospital resulted in a fruitful year for customer satisfaction. The SMC ranked No. 1 for the seventh consecutive year and 23rd time overall in the hospital category of the "2024 Korean Customer Satisfaction Index" (KCSI) by the Korea Management Association Consulting. It also secured the top position for the 17th consecutive year in the "2024 CEO's Luxury Brand," selected by CEOs of the top 500 companies. The hospital's service excellence was recognized with its 18th No. 1 ranking in the "2024 Korean Service Quality Index" (KS-SQI) by the Korean Standards Association. Notably, the SMC earned the top spot in the "2024 Korea Brand Star" for the 21st consecutive year, solidifying customer trust. In addition, the Samsung Medical Center YouTube channel won the "Winner" prize in the Medical/Health category of the Digital Ad & Campaign division at the "17th &Award 2024," and received an award in the Hospital division of the Lifestyle Service category at the "Mobile Award Korea 2024" for the seventh consecutive year. The hospital was also named No. 1 among general hospitals in the "Global Customer Satisfaction Index" (GCSI) survey by the Global Management Association, marking 2024 as a year of sustained recognition from customers and the public.

### 3. Historical Timeline of Samsung Medical Center

- 1981 Sep. 29 The Dongbang Life Insurance board of directors resolves to promote social welfare and medical business initiatives.
- 1982 May 31 The Dongbang Social Welfare Foundation is established as a social welfare corporation.
- 1982 Nov. Purchases the hospital site in Ilwon-dong (acquisitions continue through December 1984).
- 1983 Feb. Establishes a medical plan with the goal of expanding from an initial 500 to 1,000 beds in phases.
- 1984 Jul. 24 The site is officially designated for a general hospital under the urban plan.
- 1986 Sep. 29 Receives permission from the Seoul Metropolitan Government to implement the urban planning project.
- 1989 Mar. 24 Receives preliminary approval to establish a medical institution from the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs and the Seoul Metropolitan Government.
- 1989 Oct. 25 Signs a basic design contract with Itoki Saburo Co. of Japan.
- 1989 Nov. 28 Commences the basic design for Samsung Medical Center (representatives from Itoki Saburo Co. visit Korea for a site survey).
- 1989 Dec. 6 Forms an advisory committee, appointing figures such as President Han Yong-chul of Seoul National University Hospital.
- 1990 Apr. 3 Receives approval for a revised medical institution establishment permit (1,000 beds).
- 1990 Nov. 7 Begins civil engineering work for the Main Building.
- 1991 Feb. 23 Initiates overseas training programs for junior staff.
- 1991 Mar. 25 Signs a detailed design contract for Samsung Medical Center with Samoo Architects & Engineers.
- 1991 May. 1 Forms the Samsung Medical Center Construction Task Force Team.
- 1991 May. 3 Changes the foundation's name to the Samsung Life Public Welfare Foundation.
- 1991 Aug. 27 Holds the groundbreaking ceremony, attended by Samsung Life Insurance Chairman Kim Man-je and CEO Hwang Hak-soo.
- 1992 Mar. 26 Holds a steel frame erection ceremony.
- 1992 May. 18 Senior Managing Director Lim Dong-il is appointed as the head of the Samsung Medical Center Construction Headquarters.
- 1992 Jun. 2 Establishes the Samsung Medical Center Construction Headquarters.
- 1992 Jun. 29 Obtains permission for an increased bed capacity (1,200 beds).
- 1992 Nov. 17 Holds the topping-out ceremony for the Main Building.
- 1992 Dec. 26 Signs an affiliation agreement with Seoul National University Hospital.
- 1993 Feb. 15 Finalizes the construction plan for the Annex Building (27,769 m<sup>2</sup>, four basement levels, three ground levels).
- 1993 Apr. 12 Chairman Lee Kun-hee inspects the hospital construction site.
- 1993 Jul. 7 Holds the groundbreaking ceremony for the Annex Building.
- 1993 Oct. 6 Holds the groundbreaking ceremony for the Funeral Home.
- 1993 Oct. 26 Finalizes the name Samsung Medical Center (Official Registration: Samsung Medical Center, Samsung Life Public Welfare Foundation).
- 1993 Oct. 31 Conducts the first open recruitment examination for new employees at Sungkyunkwan University (8.7:1 competition ratio).
- 1993 Dec. 6 Conducts the resident selection examination at Seoul National University Hospital (66 residents selected).
- 1993 Dec. 14 Signs a Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS) contract with Loral Aerospace International Inc. of the USA.

- 1994 Jan. 3 Restructures the organization and holds an appointment ceremony (126 staff members appointed to Samsung Medical Center).
- 1994 Jan. 26 Installs and commissions the main computer system (Model: DEC 7620, two units).
- 1994 Feb. 7 Organizes the Opening Preparation Office (Director: Chae Soo-eung).
- 1994 Mar. 2 Han Yong-chul is inaugurated as the first President of Samsung Medical Center.
- 1994 Apr. 18 Holds an introductory seminar for physicians, featuring a special lecture by the Chairman on Apr. 26.
- 1994 May 11 Conducts the first of 11 full-scale rehearsals.
- 1994 Jun. 4 Holds a rally to establish new traditions and foster unity at the Olympic Fencing Gymnasium (1,300 attendees).
- 1994 Jun. 13 Receives the official license to operate as a medical institution (1,099 beds, 398 inpatient rooms).
- 1994 Sep. 1 Chairman Lee Kun-hee makes a second visit to the hospital site.
- 1994 Sep. 6 The first baby is born at the hospital (4:15 AM, a daughter to Mr. Cho Kook-young, an employee of Samsung Electronics).
- 1994 Oct. 1 Begins providing medical services to the general public (462 beds operational).
- 1994 Oct. 15 Holds the opening ceremony for the Funeral Hall.
- 1994 Oct. 18 Performs the first heart surgery (Professor Park Pyo-won, Department of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery).
- 1994 Nov. 1 Shin Hyun-seung is appointed as the Director of the Samsung Biomedical Research Institute.
- 1994 Nov. 9 Holds the grand opening ceremony for Samsung Medical Center.
- 1994 Nov. 9 Holds a signing ceremony for a collaboration agreement with Johns Hopkins School of Medicine.
- 1994 Nov. 30 Holds the opening ceremony for the Annex Building, housing four departments (Ophthalmology, Otolaryngology, Plastic Surgery, and Dentistry).
- 1994 Dec. 23 Holds the opening ceremony for the Health Promotion Center.
- 1994 Dec. 26 Organizes the administrative office of the medical center.
- 1994 Dec. 27 Incorporates Koryo General Hospital and Masan Koryo Hospital into the medical system.
- 1994 Dec. 30 Launches the in-house newsletter, <Samsung Medical Center>.
- 1995 Jan. 3 Shin Pil-ryeol begins his term as Vice President of Administration.
- 1995 Jan. 16 The Division of Vascular Surgery successfully performs a carotid endarterectomy, a first in Korea.
- 1995 Jan. 29 Launches a medical volunteer team for the Kobe earthquake relief in Japan (active until Feb. 28).
- 1995 Feb. 14 Performs the first organ transplant surgery (kidney transplant) by a team including Professors Lee Byung-bong, Cho Jae-won, and Choi Han-yong.
- 1995 Feb. 21 Holds the opening ceremony for the Samsung Biomedical Research Institute (48 research staff).
- 1995 Mar. 1 Implements a designated physician care system.
- 1995 Mar. 7 Successfully treats a patient with frontal lobe epilepsy using a highly complex subpial resection, a first in Korea.
- 1995 Mar. 20 Opens the Ambulatory Surgery Center, the first of its kind in Korea.
- 1995 Mar. 23 Founds the Saemteo Volunteer Group.
- 1995 Apr. 3 Opens the employee daycare center.

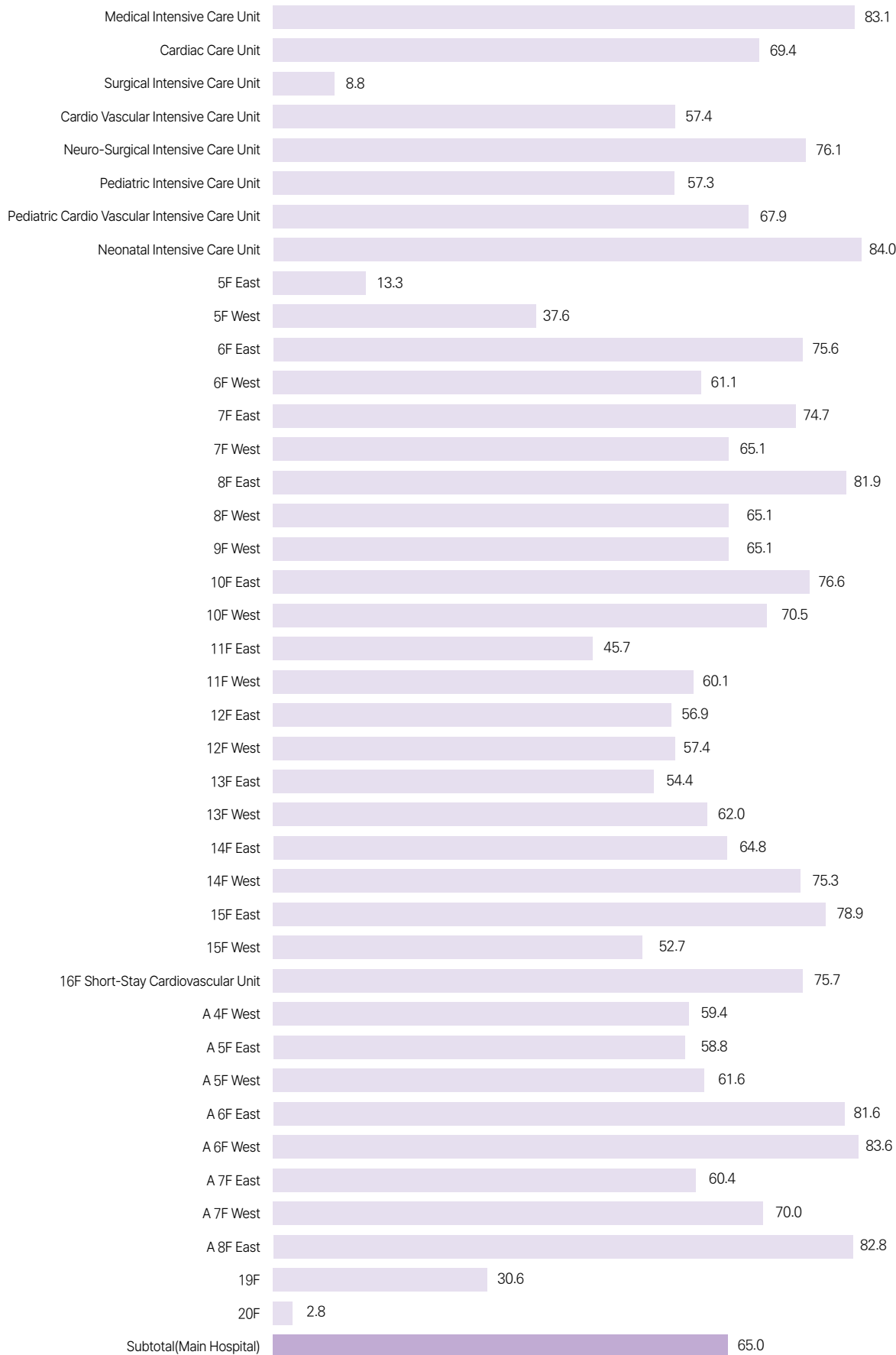


### 3) Bed Occupancy rate by Department

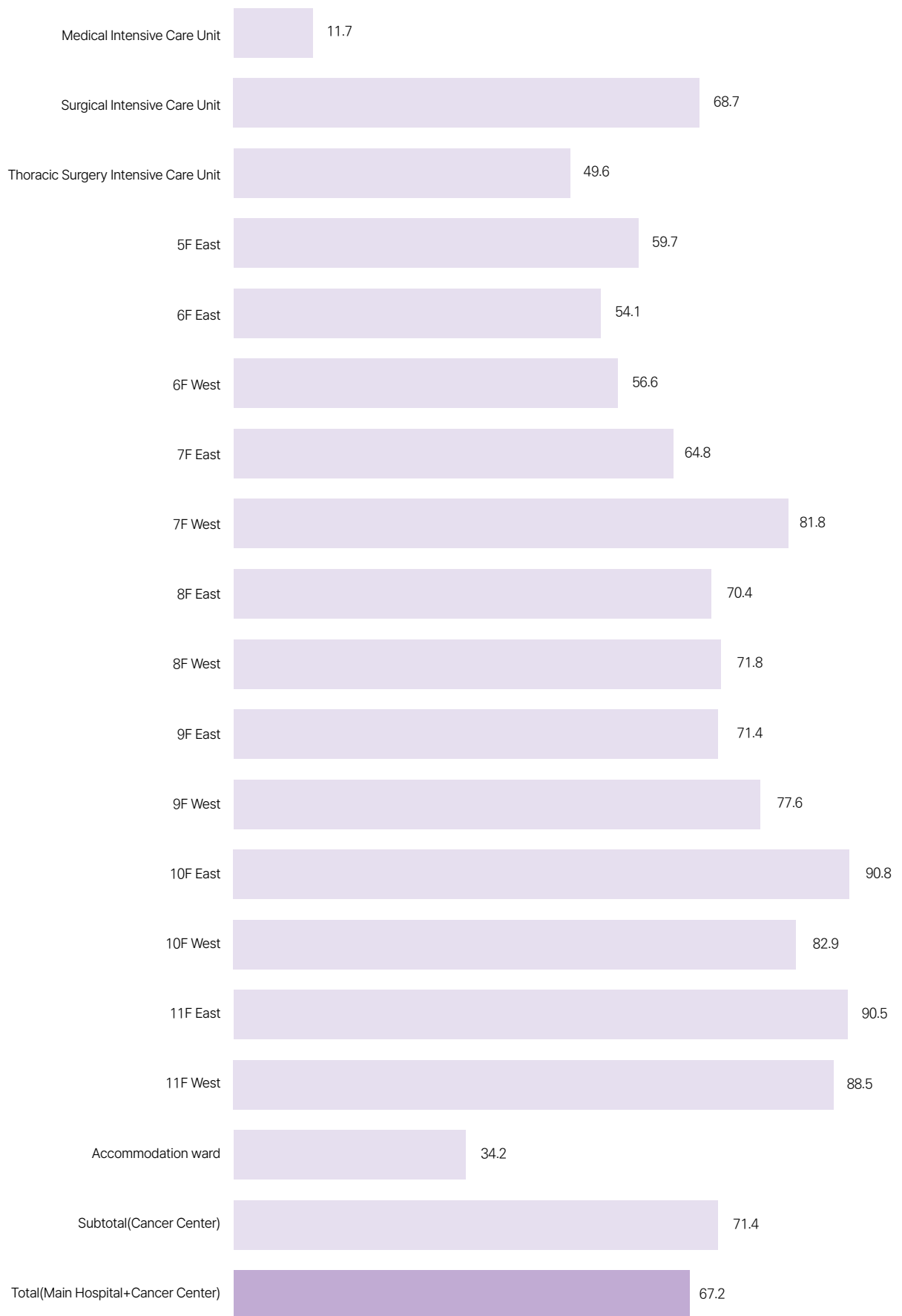

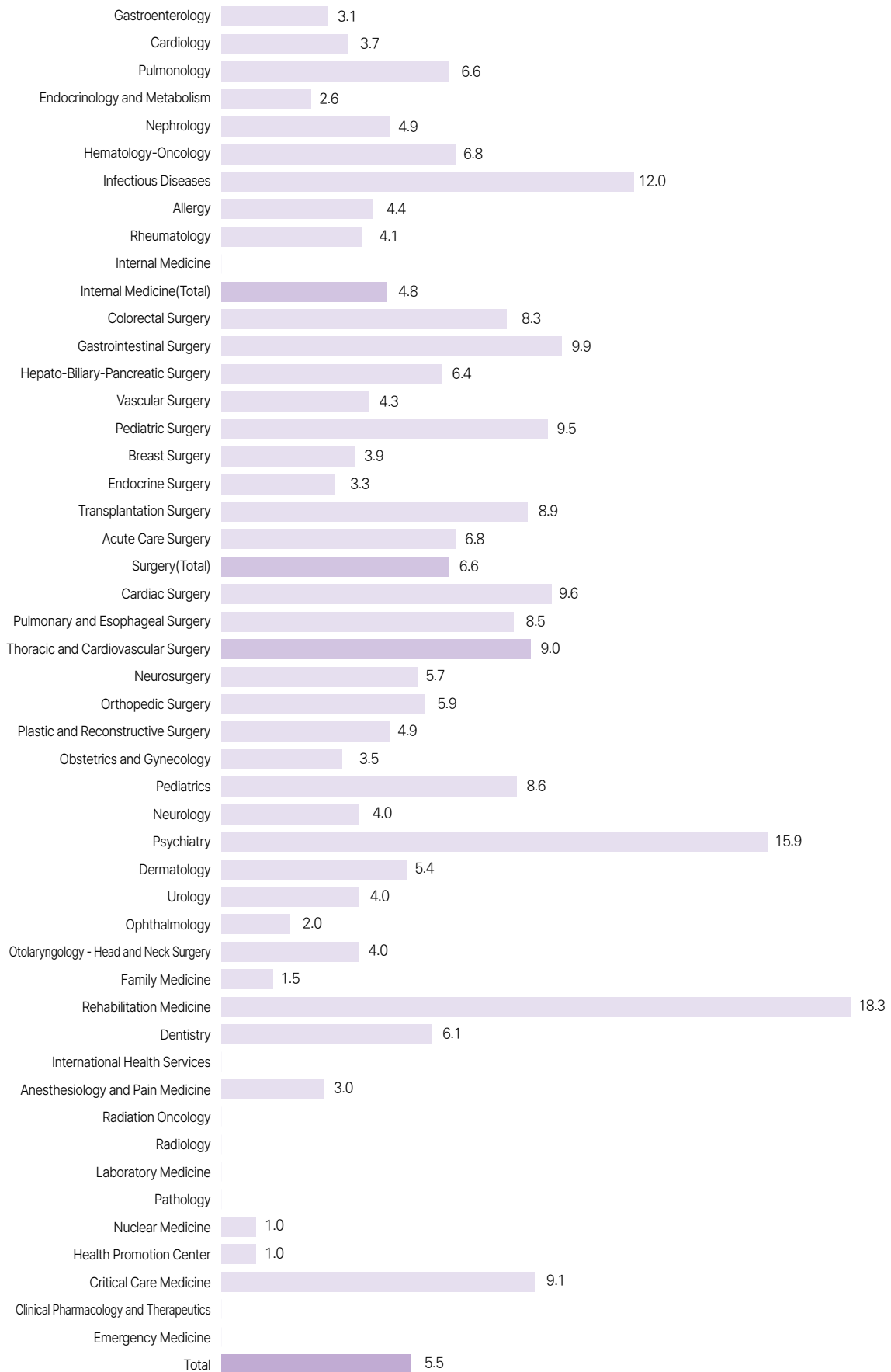

## 20. Explanatory Notes on Cancer Registry Statistics

### Cancer Registry Classification System

The International Classification of Diseases for Oncology, Third Edition, Second Revision (ICD-O-3.2) was used to classify the primary site and morphological characteristics of cancer patients.

### Scope of Cancer Registration

Only patients with tumors whose behavior codes indicated carcinoma in situ or higher were registered. (Exception: For brain tumors, patients with benign tumors or higher were registered).

### Target Patients for Cancer Registration

- 13,172 cases of inpatients diagnosed with cancer
- 11,275 cases among outpatients
  - Patients diagnosed with cancer based on pathological findings
  - Cancer patients who received radiation therapy
  - Cancer patients who received systemic anti-cancer therapy

### Analysis of Cancer Registry Data

After excluding 1,375 cases of benign and uncertain behavior brain tumors, a total of 22,187 cases of tumors classified as carcinoma in situ or higher were analyzed.
